Broomley & Stocksfield Parish Plan and YOU

The Parish Plan Group is now ready to ask you about your thoughts on the way our parish will develop over the next 5-15 years. As part of this consultation two **Action Planning Events** are being staged so that you can give us your opinions on a variety of issues we have identified so far. At the same time we would welcome your comments on any other topics you might wish to raise. These events will take place on:

Thursday 24th July 2008, 7.30 p.m. to 9.30 p.m. at Stocksfield Baptist Church. Saturday 26th July 2008, 10 a.m. to 12 noon at Stocksfield Community Centre.

Everyone is welcome at these events and the views of all, be they 5 or 95, will be noted. To make the creation of the Parish Plan a meaningful exercise and its final report a useful and practical document, we need YOUR input so do come along to one or other of the events. Among the issues which could affect the future of our parish are:


- Where will future major housing developments take place
- Where and how many wind farms will be acceptable
- Possible closure of the First School
- Possible closure of shops and post offices
- Opportunities for a Stocksfield bypass or a new River Tyne crossing
- Housing provision for an ageing population
- Creation of a village focal point for Stocksfield
- Possible future development within Broomley and Hindley
- Provision of an Internet café or drop in centre for young people
- Changes in land use affecting our environment
- With the threat of climate change and decreasing oil resources do we need to plan for a more sustainable lifestyle by using our cars less and public transport more?

If you want to have a say about the future development of your parish do come along to one of these events and make sure that the decision-makers know how you feel.

There will be interactive displays to introduce you to the Parish Plan so far, followed by workshops and general discussions based on our main theme subjects of Housing and Development, Sport and Leisure, Highways and Transport, Health and Social Care, Community Cohesion, Environment, Education and Young People.

We will publish the outcomes of these events and they will form the basis of a door-step questionnaire which will take place in the autumn.

POST OFFICES UNDER THREAT OF CLOSURE

The Parish Council is planning to hold a public meeting to discuss this contentious issue on **Wednesday 9th July, 7.30 p.m. at SICA**. We will not know, until the announcement from the Post Office on 1st July, if either of our post offices is under threat. Should it transpire that neither of our post offices is threatened with closure then the meeting will NOT be held.

If either Stocksfield or Branch End is listed for closure, we will need evidence to defend it. So we particularly want to hear from those individuals and businesses who regularly use the post offices to access their bank accounts, withdraw cash, post mail of nonstandard size or weight, and tax vehicles. If you would miss it, let us know why!

The Parish Council has now received quotations for the repair to the War Memorial and it is expected that the cost will be around £2500. The chosen contractor will be given instructions to go ahead with the repair in the next few weeks.

The Parish Council will fund the cost of this repair, however if you feel you would like to make a contribution towards the cost then please contact the Clerk to the Parish Council. The replacement plaque will be bronze as was the original.

Stocksfield Post box - too full

Concerns have been raised that the post box at Stocksfield is often full and that customers are understandably reluctant to post their mail on these occasions.

We have taken this matter up with Royal Mail. In the meantime should this happen again, it would probably be useful to make a note of the date, day and time that you are trying to post the mail. If you're not happy, you can call the Customer Services Department at Royal Mail on 08457 740 740.

Watch your speed!

The Parish Council, with the help of former County Councillor Ray Thompson, is installing Vehicle Activated Traffic Signs at two points on the A695. These signs will be moved around the village from time to time. The legal speed limit in Stocksfield is 30 MPH, if you exceed that limit, you will activate these signs.

Our children walk and bike around the parish and, in places, the pavements are narrow or non-existent. Please watch out for pedestrians and bikers on the roadway.

Congestion at Bus Stops

Following complaints by bus drivers that they are missing passengers at Birches Nook Eastbound and Branch End Bus Stops, because of parked cars, the County Council is to refresh the existing bus stop road markings.

This work will be undertaken in conjunction with work to reinstate the highway road markings. If you park near bus stops, please leave room for the bus to pull right into the bus stop and also try to ensure that the driver can clearly see if passengers are waiting to board.

Sheep Worrying

There have been reports recently of sheep worrying by dogs, at least two lambs have been killed by a walker's dog which was off the lead while walking a local footpath through a field. Please be sure that you have full control of your dog when walking paths which cross fields containing livestock.

We have also had reports of dog walkers not being fully in control of over-exuberant dogs. Please be aware that dogs should be kept under control at all times. Thank you.

Fly Tipping

With the reopening of the Prudhoe Household Waste Recovery Centre on 23rd June, the Parish Council hopes that incidents of fly tipping in the village will stop. If you cannot get rid of your waste in your bins, please either take it to the tip at Prudhoe, or Hexham, or ring Tynedale Council and ask them to arrange for it to be collected. The Recycling Area at the Sportsfield Car Park is not a tip,

no waste should be left there. If the recycling skips are full, please advise the Parish Clerk who will arrange for them to be emptied and please do not leave your waste beside the full skips. Thank you. **Keep Stocksfield Tidy!**

BALSAM BASHING!



On 6th May, members of the Rights of Way & Environment group met with Ceri Gibson of the Tyne Rivers Trust about eradicating Himalayan Balsam from the banks of Stocksfield Burn. Ceri gave advice on identifying the balsam while it is still in its seedling stage. Starting as far upstream as possible, we walked the footpath to Old Ridley, and began working back downstream removing any balsam we found. The plants were still quite small so we probably missed a few but regular walkers on this path intend to continue the 'eradication programme' before any seeds form.

A second evening of 'balsam bashing' in early June attacked the extensive area of balsam around the Belliasis Burn, which can be accessed from the footpath to Eltringham. Further activities with the Tyne Rivers Trust are planned including a talk, in late September, about the work of the Trust.
