SCATA Housing Schemes Approved

The first affordable rented homes to be built in the Parish for at least 25 years are about to start on site. Working with Isos, SCATA (our local community-led development company) is providing three bungalows and four flats, to be built on two sites in Stocksfield – at the end of Guessburn, on the site of the former Snooker Club, and on the former toilets site at Branch End. Planning permission for both projects was approved by the County Council in October.

A grant of £364,000 has been provided by the Government's Homes and Communities Agency. Work should be completed by late summer 2014. The seven homes will all be rented out to local people or those with a close family connection to Stocksfield. All the purchase money for the snooker club site will now be reinvested in a major extension to the Cricket Club pavilion, providing our community with a double bonus.

Housing Needs **Survey Update**

The housing needs survey, jointly commissioned by the Parish Council and SCATA, the trading arm of Stocksfield Community Association, is now complete. The response from local people has been fantastic – more than 600 households have taken part. The results will guide the Parish Council's approach to developers' proposals in the future and provide a robust defence against them where necessary. It will also help SCATA ensure that future developments it undertakes meet local housing need and demand and have broad community support.

A presentation on the survey findings was given to the Parish Council at its November meeting and a summary of the report is included as an insert in this issue of NE43 News. downstream of the lower ford. The fish caught are not harmed in any way and are quickly returned to the burn. These surveys have always been carried out in either late August or early September and results this year were as shown below.

The surveys began in 2011 prior to the construction of a multi stage fish pass upon Stocksfield Ford. The pass is constructed from thick larch timbers which have been fastened to the concrete ford to create a resting pool and several flow deflectors across this obstruction to fish migration. Our 2012 work has made the obstruction much easier for fish to tackle, and since it went in, we've observed fish swimming and leaping through as well as signs of spawning upstream. Through our ecological surveys, we know that threatened eels are present below and above the ford. We have also counted a ten-fold increase in trout this year compared to the pre fish pass survey. We have yet to discover salmon above the ford but the likelihood of doing so has increased through the engineering of Tyne Rivers trust and through the river habitat improvements done by the Stocksfield River Watch Group.

NEWS from the Cricket Club

The sun shone and more cricket than ever was played this summer.

The 1st XI finished a creditable 5th in the Northumberland League, finishing strongly and the 2nd and 3rd XI both ended mid table.

For the first time ever the club fielded a 4th team in the West Tyne League. As well as developing a number of young players who wouldn't otherwise have played it brought a few ex players back to the game. While only winning one League game, the new team reached the League cup final and look forward to next season.

The Women's team had another good year winning the Northumberland League and fielding 8 players in the County squad.

The junior section also did well. The U18's won the West Tyne League and cup and the U15's were undefeated in League cricket, winning both the West Tyne League and the Northumberland League Championship after an exciting play-off. The club was well represented at junior county games with 17 boys and girls playing County cricket. At the younger age groups there are a bunch of talented players coming through in the U9, U11 and U13 squads so the future is bright.

The club hosted over 120 matches during the season including women and girls County games, 5 area and county festivals, various school games and cup finals.

The winter indoor Leagues for men and women have already started and with some exciting news due soon about a clubhouse development the club is already looking forward to the 2014 season.



Fish Passage Improvements at the lower ford

It is now over four years since the Tyne Rivers Trust (TRT) formed a River Watch group in Stocksfield. During those four years local volunteers have monitored the water quality in Stocksfield burn every month at a point near the Scout Hut. This is done by sampling the 'river fly' larvae of key indicator species - the ones that cannot tolerate pollution. Larvae are identified; their numbers estimated and the sampling repeated at two further positions. Results are forwarded to the Tyne Rivers Trust, who provide the Environment Agency with access to the data. The results are converted into an overall number scale and a score of 4 or less would indicate seriously polluted water. In four years of these monthly tests the lowest score has been 7 and results usually range from 10 to 13 - showing that the water quality in our burn is very good.

Late this summer the Tyne Rivers Trust and Stocksfield residents George Etherington and Norman Hooks took to the Stocksfield Burn to carry out an annual electrofishing survey. This

I would like to thank everyone who contacted me with their concerns about blocked gullies. I met with an officer from the County Council and did a full audit of the gullies in Stocksfield. Fortunately the weather was very wet and blockages became very apparent. I hope that the majority of the gullies have now been cleared. However some of them will require further work.

The County Council have requested that residents support them by keeping their hedges and trees pruned to prevent obstruction on public footpaths and roads which will help to minimise blockages, make them easier to clear and hence keep the highway clear of water.
