I would also like to say that my source of inspiration has been my mother, Mary Clayton, who some older residents will remember as the Secretary of the Community Association and a Parish Councillor."

Defibrillator

The Parish Council is to purchase two defibrillators – one to be located on the outside of the Cricket Club House and one on the outside of the Golf Club. We are very grateful to both of these organisations for agreeing to host a defibrillator.

The machines are available to anyone in the village. If someone collapses, when you ring for an ambulance the Ambulance Service will tell you where the nearest defibrillator is located and the code to open the box.

The purchase of the defibrillators has been made possible by the support of the Stephen Carey Fund and also by the very generous donations we have received towards the cost.

The Ambulance Service will be demonstrating CPR and the use of the defibrillators at the Fun Run on 14th September.

SCATA

Work has started on the scheme to provide 7 affordable homes in Stocksfield.

6 homes (2 bungalows and 4 flats) are being built on the site next to the Scout hut in Guessburn whilst I bungalow will replace the disused public toilet on New Ridley Road.

This is SCATA's (Stocksfield Community Association Trading Arm) first major project and is being undertaken in partnership with ISOS, the social housing provider. Significant financial support has been provided by the Homes and Communities Agency and the Parish Council has given its wholehearted backing.

The entire project should be completed by March 2015. The properties, which are subject to a local lettings policy, will then be available for rent via the Northumberland Homefinder service.

One important aspect of the scheme is that the money generated from the sale of the Guessburn site is being re-cycled to provide a major enhancement of the sporting facilities in the village with a significant development of the club house facilities at the sports field.

Department of Energy & Climate Change

Households carrying out energy efficiency improvements on their home can now get more money back to offset the cost of having the work done. From June, people in England and Wales will be able to get up to £7600 back through a new Green Deal Home Improvement Fund which is intended to enable them to take control of their bills and have warmer, greener homes.

The scheme helps people to install energy efficiency measures such as solid wall insulation and new heating systems by providing them with money back on the contributions they make towards improvements.

Hoodsclose Surface Mine, Whittonstall

Most people are already aware of the fact that the Hoodsclose opencast site application has been withdrawn.

The Whittonstall Action Group (WAG) is delighted with the news, being certain that if action had not been persistently taken since October 2009, the application would indeed have gone through. They thank all who supported their campaign.

However the UK Coal withdrawal, presumably based on their belief that the planners would advise against the scheme, leaves many questions. For this reason, WAG will continue to work with Northumberland County Council to ensure that the lessons learned from Hoodsclose are incorporated into the forthcoming core strategy for Northumberland, thereby affording the greatest possible environmental protection for the future.


LOVE Northumberland **Awards**

Congratulations to Broomley School who were winners in the LOVE Northumberland Awards 2014, Best Children's Project, for the Broomley Bee Project.

The Broomley Bee Project, in conjunction with Broomley First School, focuses on enthusing and engaging children with the wonders of beekeeping and involves the children in understanding more about the problems facing the honeybee population.

Pupils and staff at the school, with the support of local beekeepers, visit the school's own beehives to check the bees and learn how essential pollinators are to the environment.

The pupils, along with staff and family members, have also worked hard to create a beautiful bee garden in a neglected corner of the school grounds. The project is entirely volunteer-led, and everyone involved gives their time freely. Local businesses and members of the community have supported the project and there have been many innovative ideas for raising funds, especially through school fairs.
