Watch Your **Neighbourhood**

There has been much debate over the past 12 months about the benefits of Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) and there is a clear desire from many residents to be part of a NHW scheme where they live. Unfortunately the key ingredient to NHW - the co-ordinator - has been and remains an elusive character. Despite appeals at meetings, in this newsletter and on the website, there has been no contact from any resident willing to act as a NHW co-ordinator. As a consequence, the Parish Council has decided not to organise any further NHW meetings. The absence of a formal NHW scheme in Stocksfield does not affect the ability of the community to act as the eyes and ears of the police. Please remember that whenever you see anything suspicious or out of the ordinary, don't assume that someone else will ring the police – do it yourself. And don't forget the basic crime prevention advice – lock your doors even if you are in, don't leave ground floor windows open and keep ladders locked away.

Stocksfield's affordable homes project wins National Housing Award



The development of seven affordable homes – six in Guessburn and one at Branch End – has won national



acclaim after picking up a National Housing Award in London.

At a high profile ceremony in front of 600 invited guests at the London Lancaster Hotel, representatives from SCATA (Stocksfield Community Association Trading Arm) and Isos Housing were thrilled and surprised to be announced as the winners of the 'Best Partnership Award'. Five directors of SCATA, together with Vince Walsh, development manager at Isos Housing, are pictured after receiving the award from comedian and TV personality Marcus Brigstocke.

The National Housing Awards are run by the National Housing Federation and celebrate excellence in affordable housing. The citation from the judges was particularly pleasing, describing the project as '.... a good example of local positive control to meet local housing needs' and '...a structure that could be replicated elsewhere as a way of meeting changing demand in smaller communities'.

Meanwhile, back in the village, Mr and Mrs Wilson, the new tenants of Branch End Cottage on New Ridley Road, have quickly turned the front garden into a glorious display of colourful plants and flowers. They are pictured with Pete Duncan, Chair of SCATA. Commenting on the completion, Pete said 'It's quite an improvement on the old derelict toilets'.

On behalf of the Parish Council, Chair Maggi Hunt congratulated SCATA and Isos Housing on winning the Award, and said "We are pleased that we were able to support this development from the outset, with help from the County Council."

SAVED - the 613

Over the last five years the future of the Tuesday 613 weekly bus from Whittonstall to Hexham via New Ridley Road has been under close scrutiny by the County Council because of the high subsidy due to low use. A further review began last year. As you may have seen, the service will now definitely continue.

County Councillor Anne Dale thanks everyone who has supported the service. She said, 'In particular a big thank you must go to Vicky Jeffcock who for the past year has not only promoted the use of the bus but also kept a weekly record of the number of people using the bus. The service is now being delivered by PCL travel from Prudhoe and is very popular. If in future there is an identified need for an additional service on another day of the week, which must also be sustainable, this would be considered by the Council.

Tyre Dumping and Garden Rubbish

As the darker nights draw near, the potential for unscrupulous traders to dump waste, particularly tyres, in the quiet country lanes around the village increases. The Parish Council asks all residents to be additionally vigilant. If you see vehicles in suspicious circumstances, please record as much detailed information as you can and contact either the police (if it is happening at the time) or the County Council. If you come across rubbish that has been tipped, please report it to the County Council who will remove it.

There have been incidents of garden and other waste being dumped within the village on verges, hedgerows and the banks of the burn, at least some of which must have been by residents. If you see this unlawful activity occurring, please report it and together let's keep Stocksfield a clean and pleasant place in which to live, work and visit.

Who's **Your Doctor**?

Residents may be aware that from April of this year all surgeries are required to provide their patients with a named General Practitioner (GP). This doctor will have overall responsibility for the care and support that the surgery provides to individuals but this will not prevent a person from seeing any GP at the practice.

The surgery works as a team and wants patients to see the doctor of their choice, which may vary depending on a person's condition or personal preference. Allocating specific patients to individual GPs was considered, but an arbitrary way of allocating names was preferable as it really does not affect which GP a person can see.

GPs have been allocated according to the first letter of a resident's surname as follows:

Dr L Corbett:

surnames commencing A - C

Dr A Maguire:

surnames commencing S-Z

Dr L Dornan:

surnames commencing $\,D$ - G and L

Dr S Gupta:

surnames commencing N - R, J and I

Dr F Kamali:

surnames commencing H, M and K

Flood Plan Revisited

Applications **Granted!**

This year the Parish Council has already made a number of grants and donations amounting to over £3,000. If you are considering applying for a grant, time is running out. All grant applications for this financial year must be received by the Parish Council by 30 September and cannot be for more than £500.

If you are considering making a grant application in excess of £500 for the financial year commencing in April 2016, the application must be received by 30 September 2015 to allow the application to be considered in tandem with the budget and precept setting process.

Season's News from the **'SCG'**

Stocksfield's Cricket teams have once again had a good season albeit silverware has escaped most of the sides. After being promoted to the Northumberland Tyneside Senior League, a tough season was expected for the 1st and 3rd teams but both performed well to finish in the top six. The second team stayed in the top 4 throughout in the West Tyne League 1st Division, and the 4th XI continued to develop the younger players. The development of the juniors (who regularly played in the senior sides) was pleasing to see, with some fine performances which bodes well for next year. The U18 team won the West Tyne League and were beaten finalists in the county wide Lingarde Cup. New players joined the women's teams this year and the two teams played well, the 1st team being runnersup in the Northumberland League. Junior sides at UI5, UI3 and UII played in the Northumberland Junior League and recorded some notable victories, though form varied due to availability of players and poor weather most Sundays! Once again a number of boys and girls represented the club in the County teams from U17 down to U11 and did well.

An awards evening for the senior sides is on Saturday 10th October when the best performances during the season are recognised.

Off the field, the club are planning to develop the clubhouse and fundraising starts in earnest this autumn. Particular thanks go to all the volunteers who support the club in so many ways. Anne takes off one hat

Until September's meeting, County Councillor Anne Dale has been wearing two hats at Parish Council meetings, having been co-opted onto the Council when numbers of councillors were very low. Anne has decided to stand down from the Parish Council but will continue to attend meetings as a County Councillor. Her dual role always gave potential for conflict and this move allows her to concentrate on her county role. Maggi Hunt, Chair of the Parish Council, said 'We'd like to thank Anne for volunteering herself for co-option at a time when the Council ran the real risk of not being able to make decisions because of vacancies. Whilst we still have nine councillors, we need to fill the three vacancies. Council's clean bill of health

For those who are interested in the minutiae of local government – the Parish Council is subject to two types of audit each year. First an internal audit is undertaken by a local auditor who inspects the Council's accounts and accounting practices in depth. Second an auditor appointed by the Government carries out an external audit at the end of the financial year, based upon an annual return submitted by the Council. The external auditor, a company called BDO LLP, has completed the audit for the financial year 2014/15 and has concluded that no matters have come to their attention giving cause for concern. That's not it though, because the Council ensures it continues to comply with its own financial regulations and the internal auditor soon begins the inspection of the accounts for 2015-16.

Blooming Stocksfield

The Parish Council would like to thank those local businesses who have sponsored one or more of the hanging baskets that adorn some of the buildings in the village. The baskets have been kindly prepared by volunteer members of the local Plants and Garden Society, ably co-ordinated by Mike Cummings. Some observant residents have also noticed an increase in flowering verges earlier in the year and the Parish Council extends their thanks to the anonymous benefactor.



Police Phone Scam Warning

Police are continuing to warn people to be alert to a phone scam after further incidents have been reported.

Fraudsters, pretending to be police officers, are targeting people over the phone and trying to con them out of their life savings.

Officers are currently investigating eight incidents which have been reported from the Tynedale area.

The con involves a member of the public receiving a call from a person pretending to be a police officer. This fake officer tells the victim that their bank account is at risk of being hacked and they face having their money stolen.

They are told to contact their bank and withdraw all of the money from their account as soon as possible and that a police officer will come to their house, collect it and take statements.

They then arrange a date and time for an 'officer' or courier to come and pick the cash up and take a statement.

Police are urging people to be on their guard and to take steps to avoid becoming a victim:

- Be aware that fraudsters often use techniques to hold your phone line open, so that when you try to dial out to verify the caller, they intercept and re-answer the call, claiming to be the bank or law enforcement.
- To ensure that your phone has not been compromised, use a different phone line to verify the caller. Where a second phone line is not available, try calling a family or friend first, as the fraudster will find it difficult to impersonate a person you know.
- Never disclose your PIN or online / telephone banking log-in information or card reader codes to anyone, even if the caller claims to be from the bank or police. Remember, banks and the police NEVER call and ask you to disclose these security details.
- If you receive a call requesting your PIN, card details or online / telephone banking log-in information, end the call immediately.
- If you receive a suspicious or unexpected call, always verify the caller by taking their phone number and getting it checked independently.
- Ensure elderly relatives and neighbours are aware of the fraud and crime prevention advice.

Report any suspicious phone calls to police straight away on 101 ext 69191.
